Country. Vancouver, B.C., Nov. 9.—The inspection of tea for this province is not considered satisfactory. A tea involced at 10 cents a pound or inder cannot be passed by the customs authorities here until a sample of shipment is taken out of the packages here and forwarded to Ottawa for judgment and returned here, which means two weeks at least that the Sipment lies flere, useless, and at a loss for interest and risk of fire, etc. The United States, recognizing this hardship, have inspectors at all their ports on the Pacific Coast.
