MARKET WAS QUIET

Dulness All Round Was the Principal Feature.

Corn Market Closed Barely Steady - Oats Dull and Provisions a Shade Easier on Larger Receipts - Latest Commercial News.

Saturday Evening, Sept. 30. Wheat went up in Chicago to-day, December closing at 73 1/2, and May at 76 1/2. What futures closed 1/4 higher to 1/2 in Liverpool.

World's estimated wheat shipments are 4,200,000 bushels.

Receipts at Chicago stock yards to-day were: Hogs, 18,000; estimated for tomorrow, 24,000; best steady; others weak. Cattle, 200; unchanged.

Cars of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth, 6771 last week, 2091 last year, 1277.

Grain received at Chicago to-day: Wheat, 29 cars; on contract, Corn, 1230; on contract, 537. Oats, 32; on contract, 55.

Liverpool cotton closed to-day four points lower than Thursday's close for October and November.

GRAIN AND PRODUCE. Flour-Ontario patents, in bags, \$3.70 to \$3.80; straight rollers, \$3.60 to \$3.50.

Wheat-Ontario, red and white, 67c north and west; 70c north and west; No. 1 Manitoba hard, 80 1/2c; Toronto, and No. 2 Northern at 76 1/2c.

Oats-White oats quoted at 25c west. Rye-Quoted at 63c, north and west.

Barley-Quoted at 42c for No. 2 west; feed barley, 35c to 36c.

Corn-Canadian 80c west and American 40c on track here.

Outmeal-Quoted at \$3.40 by the bag and \$3.50 by the barrel, on track at Toronto, in car lots.

Peas-At 60c north and west for immediate shipment.

TORONTO FRUIT MARKET. Receipts for a Saturday, were heavy; prices steady, but trade in little supply.

Apples-Common, 20c to 25c per basket; plums, 35c to 40c; pears, 40c to 45c; Bartlett and 25c to 30c; common, 15c to 20c.

Oranges-15c per basket, muskmelons, 20c per basket; medium, 15c to 20c; crab apples, plentiful, at 25c to 30c; Spanish onions, \$1.10 to \$1.25 per crate.

ST. LAWRENCE MARKET. Receipts to-day were very heavy, consisting of 11,000 bushels of grain, 28 loads of eggs, 6 loads of straw, and a supply of vegetables, eggs, poultry and butter.
