BOTH ARMIES WELL EQUIPPED Costa Rica Head of Insurgent Government—Colon and Panama Crowded With Soldiers.

Chicago, Oct. 14.—The steamer arriving from Boca del Toro brings the news that the Colombian government troops and insurgents are getting the arms and ammunition they need.

Most of the supplies and munitions of the insurgent army are being sent to Costa Rica. The insurgent government is at present at San Jose, the capital of Costa Rica.

The indications are that both sides are tired of the general warfare which has been going on for several months.

General Panza, who is expected to return to the Olaya, the seat of the government, has been captured by the rebels.

The government has selected all boats belonging to natives and hired steamships belonging to foreign firms for patrol duty along the coast.

One of the owners, Braden, who was arrested and also sent to Colon as a prisoner, the matter has been held by the German consul.

It is thought that the Colombian officials will yield rather than become involved with Germany.
