MAY PROTEST OTAWA,

Ottawa, May 31.—Another election protest to loom into imminence is one against Mr. Murphy, the new member from Ottawa. It is said that Mr. Murphy's name appears on bonds given by a large printing firm to the government. So long as this is the case he is, by the statute, clearly precluded from taking his seat, and it is a question for the courts to decide whether the election is voided or not. Generally parkamentary candidates are fastidious on the legality of these petitions, and before every general election there are always numerous resignations from petty offices held under the Crown, as well as requests to be released from bonds such as Mr. Murphy's. The act reads:

No person whatsoever holding or enjoying, undertaking or executing, directly or indirectly, alone or with any other, by himself or by the interposition of a trustee or party, any contract, or agreement with His Majesty, or with any public officer or department with respect to the public service of Ontario, or under which any public money of Ontario is to be paid for any service or work, matter or thing, shall be eligible as a member of the Legislative Assembly, nor shall he sit or vote an 'the same.'


