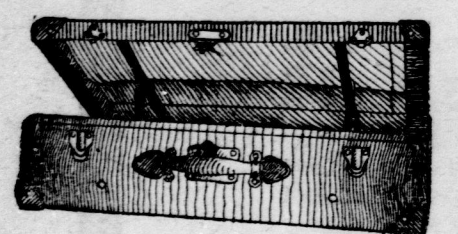

Late grain will be badly damaged but farmers believe they can save any grain that was in the stiff dough stage before the storm.

Death of Mrs. McKenzie.

Mrs. McKenzie was born in Waterloo, in which town and in Goderich she lived for many years. After her husband's death several years ago, she went to Woodstock to reside with her daughter. was brought home. Deceased was 71 years of age. Besides Mrs. Robertson, two sons survive her, one in London, and the other in Santa Barbara, Cal. The funeral will be held on Saturday morning from her daughter's residence to the G. T. R. station. Interment will take place in Goderich.

HANG HABITUAL CRIMINALS

Would Apply Death Penalty for Attempts To Commit Capital Crimes.

Chicago, Sept. 19.—Attorney General Bonaparte, in an address today before the National Prison Wardens Association, demanded the death penalty as a punishment for habitual criminals.

Obedience to the law he declared to be the primary purpose of punishment. He defined at length the relation of criminals to society. The primary purpose of punishment, he said, is to assure obedience to the law. When inflicting punishment the state looks not to the past, but to the future, not to the individual who has disobeyed and now suffers, but to all the individuals who may hereafter fear to disobey by reason of his sufferings.

"We have developed a class of men who pass a very large part of their adult years in one after another prison, using their intervals of liberty only to devise and perpetrate new crimes," he said. "The habitual criminal, it must be remembered, is a product of modern civilization. Our ancestors would have hanged him for his first felony, or if by any chance he escaped of this fate he would have almost surely died of some of the maladies then epidemic in prisons while awaiting trial for the second. I would not have men hanged to day for a trifling theft, but I would have modern society cease to nourish and shelter its proved and inveterate enemies."

"Some years since I suggested that an attempt to commit a capital crime ought to be made itself capital, and that when the man has been already thrice convicted of major crimes, upon his conviction for his fourth offense of the like grade he should be liable to the death penalty. I have seen no reason to repent of these suggestions."

BIG FIRE IN MADRID

Houses Destroyed at Night and People in Panic—May Be Forty Injured.

Madrid, Sept. 18.—One of the biggest fires ever known here started late last night in the Calle Isidro, in the artisans quarter. It spread quickly, causing a panic among the residents of the district.

Firemen and soldiers worked heroically to rescue the inmates of the houses, but terror made the people unmanageable. They clamored for help, but numbers refused to leave their homes without their belongings.

It became necessary finally to drag them into the streets. Fourteen houses were destroyed, and 30 or 40 persons were injured, some of them seriously.

Many of the people are destitute and are now camping in the streets. King Alfonso, who is absent from the city, telegraphed to the Infante Fernando to visit and add the sufferers on his behalf.
