## A LOW WIDE FRONT COTTAGE

WHERIE the lot will admit of it, a wide front is always a big advantage. This cottage is 33 ft. in width and 32 ft. in depth over the front piazza, which is 10 ft. in width. The plan is well suited to an east frontage, bringing the large living room on the south side and also to the east. It is estimated to build this cottage for \$2,500 exclusive of heating and plumbing. It is of well constructed frame, covered with wide Colonial or drop siding and the lower section of the window sills is veneered with a dark Oriental brick. There is a full basement, with concrete foundation.

The entrance is in the center of the front with central vestibule and wide hall, the main staircase carried up in the center opposite the entrance. The living room is 12 ft. 6 in. in width and 21 ft. in depth, with wide central fireplace placed on the outside. This plan has many good features, the dining room on the right, with sliding doors to the kitchen, linen closet and bath room. The attic is intended for storage space only and is low.

The exterior appearance is on the Colonial order, with a wide projected chimney at each side and finished up above the gable ends. The outside should be in Colonial white and the roof green. This will make a very attractive combination.
