FRANCE BEGINS BUILDING ANEW

Marked Progress Made in the Task of Restoring War-Torn Provinces of North.
Paris, July 27.—"Never in the whole course of the ages has any country had so many deaths to mourn, so many wounds to heal, never has a government been confronted with so gigantic a heap of ruins. And never has a people faced with greater courage the formidable obstacles that stand before the French people in their task of reconstruction."

ABOUT 100 MEN FLY QUITE REGULARLY TO BUSINESS FROM HOME
Number of Itinerant Aerial "Taxi-Drivers" Is Placed At 300.
DEMAND IS INCREASING
Does Not Equal Supply, Says Report Made to Manufacturers' Aircraft Association.

New York, July 27.—About 100 businessmen, scattered throughout the United States, more or less regularly fly in aeroplanes between their homes in the country, at the mountains or the shore to their city offices, according to an estimate of the Manufacturers' Aircraft Association. The number of itinerant aerial "taxi-drivers" who carry passengers on short but remunerative flights is placed at some 300. "There is a steadily increasing demand for aircraft of the commercial type," says a report made to the association by the United States, but not equal the supply. Factories now in operation in the United States could construct ten times the number of aircraft which optimists estimate would be required this year.
A trip through the country taken by representatives of the association revealed some interesting uses to which aircraft are being put. "In Seattle during the tourist season," the investigation reported, "a passenger aeroplane makes daily runs over and around Mount Rainier, flying at 20,000 feet, some 5,000 feet above the mountain." At the Santa Barbara seaside resort a flying boat is in daily operation over the channel, two of its most interesting passengers during the early part of this year having been the King and Queen of Belgium.
Regular flights are being conducted over Southern California with a baby boom.
"There is considerable agitation for an extension of the aerial forest patrol in California, which has been instrumental in protecting life and property from forest fires. The California Rice Growers' Association, which last year established a service patterned after the forest patrol, over 10,000 acres of rice lands, has enlarged this service to guard double that acreage.
"Two flying boats are being used for transporting supplies from Seattle to a mining operation in British Columbia."
In the case of tourists going from England to the continent the association has been instrumental in securing European governments to issue international passes which enable holders to proceed immediately to their way as soon as their papers have been examined by the customs authorities. In the absence of these passes, long and irritating delays would often be experienced in entering and leaving various countries.
The British Automobile Association is also having special motoring maps prepared, not only of Great Britain but of the continent and through its agencies in every country it is prepared to take charge of repairs and to supply tires and parts. The association has offices in all the larger continental cities, and the staffs at these places are the disposal of all American motorists as readily as are the association's staffs in Great Britain.

EUROPE PREPARES FOR U. S. TOURISTS

COURTESY IS COMMON COMMODITY IN MEXICO
MEXICO CITY, July 27.—Courtesy is a common commodity in Mexico. Mexican tourists are large numbers of them. The roughest soldier will not pass one in a narrow corridor without saying, "Con permiso" or "dispenso," which are Spanish expressions equivalent to "excuse me." The same phrase is invariably used by every person who takes leave of another, to which the answer invariably is "Pase adelante," or "Go ahead." It is customary to say "At number" to a servant, or "Go home" (or office), the implication being that the new friend is to consider one's home his own.
Persons introduced to each other, when their respective names are pronounced, say, "Your name is so and so," or "Juan Garcia, for the purpose of serving you, sir."
When taking leave of each other formal acquaintances who wish to continue relations with each other say, "I remain at (or I offer myself to) your service."
Observance of these forms, which a Mexican rarely disregards, is a valuable aid to a stranger who wishes to establish profitable "commercial" or pleasant social relations in Mexico.
PASTOR DISCONTINUES "LADIES" "GENTLEMEN"
PORTSMOUTH, England, July 27.—The use of the words "ladies" and "gentlemen" in church has been discontinued in the parish so far as he is concerned, says the Rev. Bruce Cornford in his parish magazine.
"The words have now absolutely no meaning," he writes. "Polish class distinction should have no place in the church. Even the Master called his mother 'woman,' while no one would insult St. Peter by calling him gentleman. The parochial council consists of men and women."
