LOUIS PERRINI JURY DIVIDE FOR ACQUITTAL

Miss Springstead Awarded \$1500 Against Street Railway for Wrenched Knee.

HAMILTON, Jan. 13.—(Special).—The jury that tried Louis Perrini on the charge of aiding and abetting a person in the commission of a crime, six standing for conviction and six for acquittal. The verdict is looked upon as about equivalent to acquittal. It was charged that Perrini procured and counseled Giovanni Foranelli, an Italian, to vote at the election in the name of Cyrus Ross, whose house he bought. T. C. Robbette, K.C., Toronto, defended Perrini. The women were called out this evening to the residence of John McClelland, Leeching-street, where five had started in the morning doing considerable damage to a piano in a room.

Offer to Sell Park.
The Bank of Hamilton offered this evening to sell the park board fourteen acres of land at the head of West North-street, for \$25,000. The board thought the price too high and will offer what they think it worth. There was some talk of pulling down the gate pillars at the entrance of Dunfurn Park, but no action was taken.

Awarded \$1500.
At the assizes this afternoon Miss Springstead, who wrenched her knee while getting off a street car that did not wait long enough to let her off in safety, was awarded \$1500 damages. Four other damage actions against the company were settled.

At the annual meeting of the West North-street Baptist Church here this evening a resolution was passed calling upon the city council to reduce the number of liquor licenses from 68 to 50. Reports showed receipts of the year to be \$7175, and there was a deficit of \$4. There are 224 members.

Westminster Church.
The congregation of Westminster Presbyterian Church this evening endorsed the petition to cut off 48 liquor licenses. The following managers were elected: J. H. C. Thompson, Jas. Jackson, Wm. Braid, John Stephens, Philip Elder, Frank Burdett, James Boyd and D. Knox. A recommendation to the board of managers to increase the salary of Rev. Roy Vanwyck, the pastor, was passed. The church has a membership of 121, showing an increase of 30. The receipts amounted to \$1339 and there was a surplus of \$29.

Boy Disturbers Pined.
For taking part in the disturbance last Saturday night, organized by interested parties in connection with the sale of the Sunday World, 240 following boys were fined \$5 each in police court this morning: Fred Atkinson, I. Alter, Robert Fraser, Edward Carson, Harry Brown and Thompson Bowen. The Spectator Printing Company is planning to move its job plant to Toronto, and to amalgamate with the Mail Job Printing Company.

Printers Get Agreement.
The three local newspapers and their printers have reached a new agreement for three years. Ad. men, make-up men, bankmen and proofreaders, whose minimum has been \$14.50 a week, will get \$16 for this year, \$16.50 in 1910 and \$17 a week in 1911. Linotype operators will also get a raise to \$17.50 a week, instead of \$16.50. It is said that the new scale will give them a wage of from \$18 to \$25 a week. The agreement has not been signed yet, but it is said to be satisfactory to both the men and the employers. The Job Printers' and Pressmen's Union have not yet come to terms, and it is rumored that there may be trouble.

May Build Steam Railway.
It is rumored that the Canadian Northern, which controls the charter of the Toronto & Hamilton Railway, has decided to build a steam, instead of an electric, railway from Toronto to Buffalo, across Hamilton Beach, and that the work of construction will be started early next spring.

Robert Reynolds is wanted by the Brantford authorities on the charge of interfering with the police. The alleged offence was committed when Reynolds was attending a hockey match in the telephone city.
