FIRE IN THE HOSPITAL DOES \$40,000 DAMAGE
Northeast End of Main Building in Flames During Blizzard—Patients Removed Without Confusion.

ROBBIE-REEVES SHIP SECOND LOAD SILVER
Have Three Hundred Tons For Smelter This Winter—Sudbury Stores Bag Large Order.

HAMILTON, Jan. 23.—(Special.)—During the height of the snow storm Saturday an alarm of fire came in from the city hospital, and the conflagration which followed was so intense that the fire had gained such headway that the whole institution was doomed.

PHOENIX CAMP, on the road of the Gowanda Transport Company, Jan. 23.—(Special.)—A second carload of silver ore from the Reeves-Dobie Mine will be hauled over this road to Gowanda Junction, the end of the C. N. R. steel, to-day for shipment to the Thorold smelter.

When Chief Ten Eyck arrived he superintended the work of removing the patients in the wing, some fifty in number. The doctors, nurses, firemen, constables and the patients displayed remarkable coolness, and the patients were all taken to other parts of the building, and not one of them so far as had been injured was any the worse for the experience.

The mine officials state that they have 300 tons of ore valued at \$1,000,000 ready for the smelter, and will be prepared to send a carload out each week for some time.

Pastor Russell's Sermon
The Cost of Church Federation to Baptists, Adventists and Disciples

BROOKLYN, N.Y., Jan. 23.—Numerically Baptists, Adventists and Disciples represent more than one-third of the Protestants of the United States. What they must yield for church federation is therefore an important question.

University Sermon
'I came to do the will of Him that sent me.' (John vi. 38).

In every great oratorio, in every great opera, in every great symphony, said Rev. H. Rowell Bates of New York, preaching the University sermon in Convocation Hall yesterday morning, 'there is that which we call a theme. It starts at the beginning, it runs right thru to the end. No matter whether it is the deep note or the woman's voice or the full orchestra, everything, every note has to be brought into perfect harmony with this theme.'

All Christians agree that Jesus and His apostles taught baptism, and that there are but two, Lord, and one, Jesus (Ephesians vi. 5). We cannot here elaborate, but merely suggest that nowhere in the Scriptures is infant baptism commanded or urged.

Notice that it does not say, as many suppose, 'So many of us were baptized into Jesus Christ.'
