PAVE NEW STEEL BRIDGES WILL BE BUILT BY C.N.R.

It is Estimated That the Structures for the West Will Cost \$1,800,000.

Montreal, March 17.—(Special).—The Canadian Northern Railway are building five very extensive bridges of steel and masonry at the different crossings of the Saskatchewan River, in the two new provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan.

On the main line, the first crossing is that of the South Saskatchewan River, 278 miles west of Grandview, or 485 miles from Winnipeg, about 15 miles above Saskatoon.

The second crossing of the North Saskatchewan River, 577 miles west of Winnipeg, is situated 16 miles northeast of Edmonton.

The third crossing of the North Saskatchewan River, 811 miles west of Winnipeg, is situated 16 miles southeast of Prince Albert.

The fourth crossing of the North Saskatchewan River, 1,045 miles west of Winnipeg, is situated 16 miles northwest of Regina.

The fifth crossing of the North Saskatchewan River, 1,279 miles west of Winnipeg, is situated 16 miles southwest of Swift Current.
