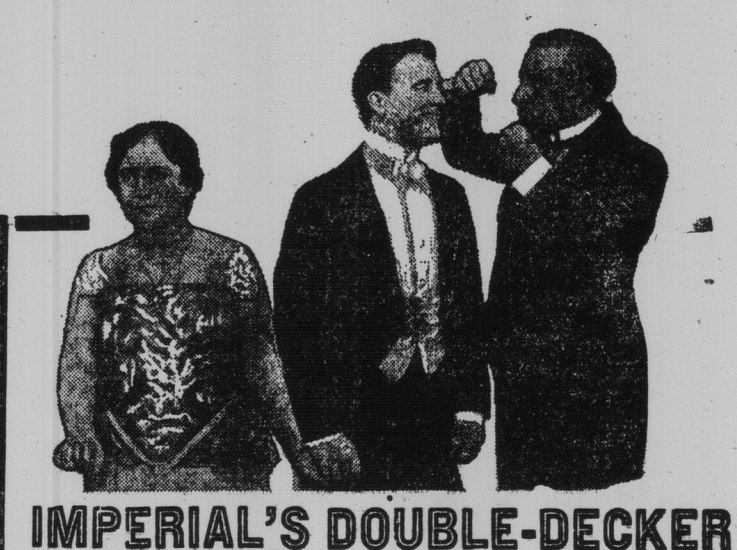

All-Around Athlete Murdered  
Philadelphia, Aug. 15.—Edward W. Lucas, widely known as an all-round athlete, 20 years ago, was shot and killed while attempting to serve a warrant in Conshohocken, near here. It was his first night on duty as a member of the police force. The warrant was for the arrest of a foreigner who was charged with the murder of a woman. Lucas, formerly a professional wrestler, boxer, swimmer and long distance runner.

Terre Haute, Ind., Aug. 15.—Mike Gibbons, the St. Paul boxer, and not his brother, Tommy, has been matched to meet Jack Dillon of Indianapolis in a scheduled ten-round bout here on Labor Day, the club promoting the match announced Tuesday. It had been stated earlier that Tommy Gibbons would oppose the Indianapolis fighter.  
THE TURF  
Moospath Entries.  
The New Brunswick Circuit races will be held at Moospath on Friday and Saturday of this week. The horses competing are, with a few additions, the same that took part in the recent races at Moncton. The horses come from parts of the maritime provinces, and it is expected that St. John sports-lovers will be treated to two days of the fastest racing that has been seen here for some time.  
Famous Mare Sold Again  
London, Aug. 15.—The famous mare, Sceptre, was sold at the late Newmarket sales to Sir W. Tatton for \$18,125. He is Sceptre's sixth owner, the previous ones having been the late Duke of Westminster, who bred her; R. Sier, who paid \$52,000, the highest price ever paid for a yearling; Sir W. Bass, who gave \$125,000; E. Tattersall, who gave \$85,750, and H. Musker, who paid the same amount.

Triple Honor for Canadian Officer  
Capt. Wm. Avery Bishop was awarded the M.C., D.S.O. and V. C. Within a Year  
London, Aug. 15.—The intrepidity of Captain William Avery Bishop, a Canadian, and a member of the Royal Flying Corps, in attacking a German air-drome single-handed, has been rewarded by the bestowal upon him of the Victoria Cross, the most prized of British val medals. The Official Gazette gives the following resume of the action which brought Captain Bishop the Victoria Cross:  
"Captain Bishop flew first to an enemy air-drome. Finding no enemy machine about, he flew to another air-drome three miles distant and about twelve miles inside the German lines. Seven machines, some with their engines running, were on the ground. He attacked them from a height of fifty feet, killing one of the mechanics.  
"One of the machines got off the ground, but Captain Bishop at a height of sixty feet fired fifteen rounds into it at close range and it crashed to the ground. A second machine got off the ground and into this one he fired thirty rounds at 150 yards. It fell into a tree. Two more machines rose from the air-drome, one of which he engaged at a height of 1000 feet, sending it crashing to the ground. He then emptied a whole drum of cartridges into the fourth hostile machine and flew back to his station.  
"Four hostile scouts were 1000 feet above him for a mile during his return journey, but they would not attack. His machine was badly shot about by machine gun fire from the ground."  
This is the third honor Captain Bishop won this year. He was awarded the Military Cross in May and the D. S. O. in June, the latter for attacking three machines and bringing down two, although he himself was attacked by four machines.

The innocent suffered for the guilty. The harvest of horror and unspeakable anguish was reaped long years after, by hands that did not sow the accursed seed.  
Her name is Legion. You will find her in every hospital in Canada, in every Home for Incurables; and her ill-fated children, whom even her divinest love could not save from the penalty of their father's unspoken heinous sin against the inexorable Law of Nature, they jabber in the wastefulness of the feeble-minded, and are in that endless procession which, through all the centuries, have crowded the asylums for the insane.  
Of course it is the Old Story. It is old as human sin. It is monotonous as the endless procession of human life. It is majestic and merciless as the organic law of human society. No man liveth to himself, or dies to himself alone. The law of transgression runs "unto the third or fourth generation of them that hate," but the law of chastity and purity and obedience works redemptively "unto thousands of them that love."
