RUSSIANS WINNING ON THE TWO FRONTS

Reports to Petrograd tell of the successful operations of the army of the Caucasus and the destruction of practically the entire 11th Teutonic army corps.

While holding Von Hindenburg in check on the Warsaw front, the Russians have taken Kizilbaba pass on the borders of Transylvania, and made further progress on the right bank of the Vistula.

Nine allied aviators dropped bombs on the railroad station and German barracks at Ostend, causing considerable damage.
