WALL ST. PRICES SPRING UPWARD AS DAY BEGINS

Constructive Forces Continue To Hold Advantage In Market

ENCOURAGEMENT IS FOUND IN RALLY

Fairly Active In Montreal And Prices Irregular At Opening

NEW YORK, April 1.—(Opening).—Encouraged by the first important rally in more than a month, constructive stock market forces continued to hold their advantage today, pushing prices sharply higher in the early dealings. Remington typewriter bounded up 3 1/2 points, American Smelting two, and initial gains of a point or so were recorded by United States Steel, Mack Trucks, North American, S. S. Kresge and Frisco. Hurried short covering sent most of the motors up under the leadership of Chrysler.

MONTREAL MARKET
Trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange during the first half hour this morning was fairly active and prices were again irregular. Late of the Woods, Bank of Nova Scotia and Montreal Breweries were the weak spots. The former opened at 157 for a loss of 2 1/2 points at 157; Bank of Nova Scotia was off 1 1/2 points at 20 1/2, and Montreal Breweries was marked down 1 1/2 points at 25 1/2. Smelters was again the most active issue, opening strong at 20 1/2 for a gain of 3/4 point, selling at 20 1/2 later and going back at 20 1/2, around 10.30. Other changes were: Bradmill up a half at 8 1/2; Converters off a quarter at 8 1/2; Power, up a quarter at 21 1/2; Textile off a half at 9 1/2; Gen. out up a half at 10 1/2; Asbestos, preferred, unchanged at 43, while National Breweries was up 1/4 at 53 1/2.

Western Stock Growers' Association Passes Resolution on Matter of Duty

CALGARY, April 1.—The Western Stock Growers' Association at its annual meeting held here yesterday went on record unanimously against strongly urging upon the Dominion Government the necessity of taking immediate steps having in view the entry of Canadian cattle into the United States market on more favorable terms than at present. The resolution continued:

"And that this convention places itself on record as strongly opposed to any policy of retaliation against that country and as favoring the admission of cattle into Canada from other countries on the same tariff terms as may be granted the Canadian cattle industry by such countries."

Returning the trip will be by the main line of the Canadian Pacific, through the great canyons of the Fraser and Thompson Rivers, and through the Selkirk and Rockies, affording scenery such as can be found nowhere else on earth; Lake Louise, the Pearl of the Rockies, the most perfect gem of scenery in the world; another day at Banff, Edmonton, the capital of Alberta; Saskatchewan, Saskatoon, the city of optimism; Devil's Gap Camp, on the Lake of the Woods near Kenora, thence to Port William, where one of the fine Canadian Pacific steamers will be used to cross Superior and Huron to Port McNicoll, then rail to Toronto, where the trip will terminate.

Everything is included in the price of \$300.00, from Toronto; transportation, sleeping cars, accommodation, meals in diners, hotels and on steamers, and sight-seeing tours at port of call, and applications for accommodation, are now being received.
