TWO ARRESTS IN PERRY CASE

Mrs. Perry will be represented by R. W. E. Landry of Yarmouth, who has been looking after her interests since the murder.

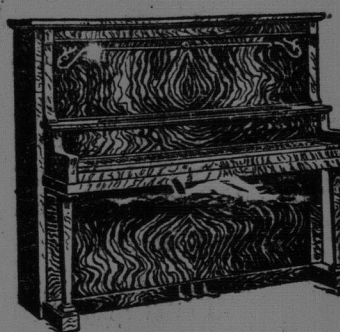
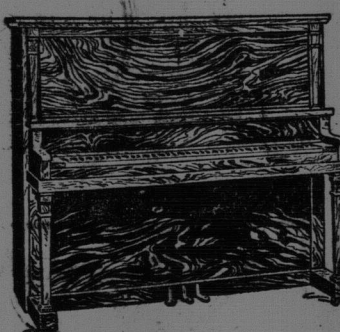
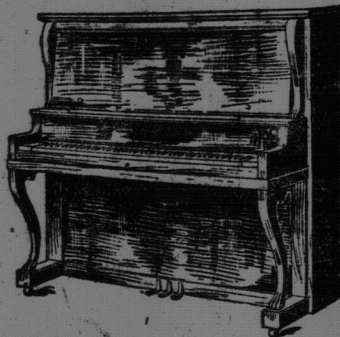
