Nature and Use of Plaster.

The question is often asked among farmers, of what use is plaster? When, where and how should it be used? And it is seldom a satisfactory answer is given them. Nearly every farmer who has made an application of plaster had made it serviceable at one time, without profitable returns at another. Not one in a hundred knows the reason

for success or failure. Most people found the application to clover attended generally with and is prepared to hire out teams and carry good results; some found it good sometimes for potatoes; but not a single one could tell, what is plaster trains. good for? 
