The attention the Indians are giving their cattle is cheering. Their cattle are in better condition than the settler's cattle. We could spare over one hundred tons of hay, but we have no market here for it.

The sheep purchased last fall, and those already on the Reservation are doing splendidly. The dogs which at first were their natural enemies, are with the aid of the Indians becoming less, and more accustomed to them, so that with careful watching, I look upon the sheep raising as a success.
