> LACE-BARK TREES ARE FEW Exist-Reason for So

There are in all about half a yields a natural lace in a readymade sheet form, which can be made up in serviceable articles of apparel. Only four of these curious species of trees are of much practical value. Tourists who have stopped at Hawaii or Samoa may recall the lace-bark clothing of the natives-clothing of a neat brown color when new, of remarkable strength and of a fragrant odor, like freshly cured tobacco leaf. The native tapa cloth, as it is called, is made from the bark of the brusonetia pap...fera, but THE it is not usually included among

the real lace-bark trees. In its natural state the real lacebark is of a delicate cream-white tint. It is probably a kind of fibrous pith. When the outer bark is removed it can be unfolded and unwound in one seamless piece, having a surface of a little more than a square yard. Wasning and sun bleaching give it a dazzling white appearance. The fabric is airily light. It is used in the West Indies for mant las, cravats, collars, cuffs, window curtains-in a word, for every purpose that crdinary lace is used. In making up shawls, veils and the like it is customary to piece two sheets of lacebark together. Delicate and apparently weak as it is in single mesh, a bit of lace-bark, if rolled into a thin string, will all but resist human strength to break it.

Despite its practical use there is no essential demand for lacebark. It has been used by the natives for hundreds of years and yet is comparatively little known to this day. A few specimens of lacebark articles exist in different countries of Europe. These were made hundreds of years ago, yet, although their age is considerable, they are said to be in a good state of preservation.



a family or any male over 18 years ald may homestead a quarter sec-Manitoha, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father,

Duties-Six months residence and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead owned and occupied by him or by his fathe, mother, son, daughter

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties-must reside upon the homestead or pre emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate afty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot ob tain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain dis tricts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties-must reside six months in earl of three years, cultivate fifty acres, erect a house worth \$300.00.
