Vienna, July 28.—Austria today declared war against Servia, official notification was sent to Belgrade for transmission to Servian government. This action was taken as soon as Austro-Hungarian government was notified that Germany had refused to become party to any conference having for its aim mediation of differences between Servia and Austria. Military measures and Austria's present course of action as regards Servia, cannot be interrupted, pending negotiations looking toward mediation. This was reply of foreign minister, M. Berchtold, today, to suggestion of Sir Edward Grey, that hostilities be suspended while Germany, England, France and Italy arranged for ambassadorial conference. Austria's reply to proposal of British foreign minister was courteous note, thanking him for his efforts, but was nothing less than a diplomatic refusal to accept mediation.


