
NATIONAL
BASEBALL
COMMISSION

New York Sept. 22--The meeting
of the National Baseball Commission
scheduled for Wednesday in this city
to arrange for the world's series with
the idea that by that time it would
be definitely known what clubs would
be contenders, will probably find the
National league pennant race still
undecided to a mathematical certainty.
The New York Giants now need
four games to assure them positively
of the National league pennant, and
the only way in which they can win
that assurance before the National
Commission meets will be the combi-
nation of victory over Pittsburgh here
tomorrow and Tuesday, together with
double defeat of the Chicago Cubs by
Philadelphia at the same time. With
little probability of such a break, it
may be that the National Commission
will further delay definite arrange-
ments for the world series until the
National league race is formally
won.

New York "fans" expect to see the
Giants clinch the championship be-
fore the end of the week. Even that
will leave Manager McGraw with only
a week's interval before the world's
series, in which to let his men ease
up from the strain of the pennant
race.
It was a very similar finish which
McGraw's men made last year, and
the strain which his men underwent
right up to the time of the world's
series was held by some critics to
have contributed to their defeat by
the Philadelphia Athletics, who had
been assured of the American league
pennant early in the fall, and who
had several weeks for preparation.
The Boston American champs have
had less time this year, but with the
pennant clinched last week they have
practically two weeks longer than the
New York team.
