## PROCEDURE AND ORGANIZATION

MOTION FOR CONCURRENCE IN THIRD REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE

The house resumed, from Tuesday, July 22, consideration of the motion of Mr. Blair that the third report of the Standing Committee on Procedure and Organization presented to the house on Friday, June 20, 1969, be concurred in, and the amendment thereto of Mr. Baldwin (p. 10963).

Mr. Stanley Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Mr. Speaker, I rise to bring to Your Honour's attention the point of order, notice of which I gave on Tuesday and which I tried to raise a few minutes ago. I do not in my experience recall a point of order being raised under Standing Order 51. I recognize that it is a very serious matter to ask Mr. Speaker to make a ruling under this Standing Order. Nevertheless I feel the importance of the matter so deeply and seriously that I believe Your Honour should be called upon to act under Standing Order 51. This Standing Order reads as follows:

Whenever Mr. Speaker is of the opinion that a motion offered to the House is contrary to the rules and privileges of Parliament, he shall apprise the House thereof immediately, before putting the question thereon, and quote the standing order or authority applicable to the case.

As I indicated earlier my point of order is against the main motion which is before the house in the name of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton (Mr. Blair). If it were possible I would have preferred to wait until the house had voted on the amendment of the hon. member for Peace River (Mr. Baldwin) so that I might then raise my point of order against the main motion, but in view of what has just happened it is likely that point will not be reached until after one o'clock tomorrow morning, and having had some experience with this device in the past I recognize it might be difficult to get the floor at that time.

We are back on the debate on the motion of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton and on the amendment of the hon. member for Peace River and it is my contention that before we proceed further I should call on Your Honour to face up to the fact, as I see it, that the motion of the hon. member for Grenville-Carleton is contrary to the rules and privileges of parliament.
