—In rendering the abuv Sam, a we əv discrimineting the vouelz in 'care' and 'her' haz ben yuzd. The noteshun empleid duz not conflict with our yus əv the letrz utherwiz, but iz in harmoni, and so permits ev opshunal yus bī thoz hu vrj it. It puzzlz us that evri exempl givn ocurz in a wurd with 'r' after the vowel, the 'r' being ether final or folod immediatli bī a consonant. We beleev 'r' the coz əv the diferens proclam'd and hold that 'r' final or with consonant sufishtentli denots it. The point iz considerd az stil opn.

—The proper shap for v. in 'eel' iz midwe betwen e and ə, espeshali wenting the stifnes əv the former, yet stil an i-shap.
