

PARISH NOTES.

OFFERTORY—August 7th, \$22.20; 14th, \$21.49; 21st, \$26.58; 28th, \$23.65. Amount required weekly, \$46.

Now that the members of the congregation who have been away during the summer months are beginning to return, we think it well to remind them that during their absence the services of the Church have been kept up as usual, and all the expenses of maintaining the Church and its work have necessarily be going on; and the offertory has been so diminished by the absence of so many that there has been a weekly loss of from \$20 to \$25, our expenses exceeding our income weekly by that amount. There are some members of the congregation who, after having been away, always make a point of counting up the number of Sundays they have been absent, and giving through the offertory the total amount which they would have given on those Sundays if they had not been away. It is only right that all should do so.

THE receipts towards the expenses of the Sunday School Festival were \$68, and the expenditure—with every effort to economise—a little over that amount. The principal items of expense were: railway fares \$28, refreshments \$30, prizes \$4, express, &c., \$5.

ON Sunday afternoon, 21st August, the Ketchum prizes allotted to the Orphans' Home Sunday School were presented by the Rev. J. D. Cayley, Chaplain of the Home. Besides Mr. Arnoldi, the Superintendent of this Sunday School, and his staff of teachers, there were several visitors present. We cannot let the occasion pass without remarking that from the appearance of the School and the demeanour of the pupils, as well as the remarks made as to the merits of each individual prize winner, it is evident that great pains have been taken to promote the efficiency of the School and the personal welfare of each scholar.

The Rector has selected as an assistant in this Parish Mr. Joseph White, one of the Senior Divinity Students at Trinity College, who is shortly about to be ordained. Mr. White is to enter upon his duties at once after his ordination.
