Bender, Prothonotary, and a grand-d. of the late Sir E. P. Taché. Is in practice as an advocate. Has been for some years a contributor to the newspaper press, and publishes Le Sentinelle newspaper. M., 9 Nov., 1848, Marie Claire, dau. of the late Pierre Garon, Esq., M.P., of Rivière Ouelle. A contractor, and built the Proyl. Parlt. Buildings in Quebec and other works. First returned to Parlt. for present seat at g.e., 1837, defeated at g.e., 1872. An unsuccessful candidate for same seat in Leg. Assem., P.Q., at g.e., 1875; and again in 1879 on the death of the sitting mem., Mr. P. A. Tremblay. Re-elected to Commons 19 March, 1881, on the sitting mem. being unseated, and re-elected at g.e., 1882, and again at last g.e. A Conservative, but opposed to the Govt. of Sir J. A.
