The Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, President of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, presented to the Senate,—A Return to an Address of the Senate, dated the 11th February, 1896, for a return showing the names of all Civil Service employees, belonging to the Secretary of State Department and to the Department of Agriculture, who have been superannuated since the 1st day of July, 1894; also giving their age; the number of years they have been in the service; their salary, and amount of superannuation allowance granted in each case.

In the case of employees not having reached the full age of sixty years, or who had not completed thirty-five years of service, the reasons for their superannuation and the report of the Treasury Board in each such case.

Also, the names, ages and years of service of all employees belonging to the aforesaid Department to whom notice has been given of the intention to dismiss or superannuate them.

Ordered, That the same do lie on the Table, and it is as follows:—
