Uplands, Ontario.	July 1st 1944		Weather partly cloudy. Accident occurred at Edwards Field - R.2 - LAC Trites, G.C., R213324, flying Harvard 3776, landed short of the boundary and applied brakes in such a manner as to cause the aircraft to overturn. A "C" category accident.	
	July 2nd 1944		"Open House" on the Station in the afternoon. Airmen and airwomen are encouraged to have their families attend Church Services in the morning. In the afternoon, a swimming meet was held in the Uplands' pool with members of the three services participating, the Navy entering two teams of WRENS and the Army having a team competing in the men's events. F/L Johnny Tett, D.F.C., former Canadian diving champion now at A.F.H.Q., gave a magnificent diving exhibition. Following the swimming meet, a concert of fine recorded music was held in the Pine Grove for the wives and friends of the airmen, while they enjoyed the picnic suppers that they had brought out, after which everyone moved to the Recreation Hall for a movie. The weather was perfect, the whole day a huge success.	
	July 3rd 1944		Weather partly cloudy. $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours dual flying only. In the evening, "Eaton's Masquers" gave a very fine performance in the Recreation Hall, the last of this season. It is hoped this very fine troupe of people will be "on the road" again this fall and have many return engagements at this Unit.	
	July 4th 1944		Weather cloudy. $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours flying dual and solo all day. F/L's McAllister, Alexander and Hensler proceeded on temporary duty to Arnprior for the purpose of giving Air Cadet Officers familiarization flights; they returned the same evening. S/O Gunion, Command Welfare Officer, paid Staff visit to Station.	
	July 5th 1944		Weather hazy and quite warm, cloudy to overcast. $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours dual, 2 hours solo flying. F/L's McAllister, Alexander and Hensler returned to Arnprior to complete familiarization flights of Air Cadet Officers. Sq/O Evans, Command W.D. Officer, paid a Staff visit to this Unit.	
	July 6th 1944		S/L Morrisette, Commanding Officer of Pendleton, accompanied by S/O Cooper, visited this Unit to study the W.D. set-up, as W.D.'s are presently being posted to Pendleton. Weather partly cloudy to cloudy. $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours flying.
