I am in receipt of your letter of the 18th ultimo enclosing voucher No.257 amounting to \$17.50 in favor of Mr.W.J. Hanna for the burial of a destitute Indian woman of the Nitinat Band, West Coast Agency, and in reply I return the voucher herewith as an explanation is desired with regard to the charge therein for \$7.50 for "grave in cemetry". If the undertaker paid that amount for being permitted to bury the woman in the cemetry, a receipt for the payment should be attached to the voucher; but, if the charge is simply for the labor performed in digging the grave, etc., the same is considered too high. \$2.00 should be a sufficient payment for the digging of the grave.
