Right Rev. Sir:-

In reply to your letter of September 28th, I have to inform you that it is still the opinion of the Department that if a new building is to be erected for the Crowfoot Boarding School, it should be erected on the new site selected by the Officers of the Department.

With further reference to your letter of August 6th, I may say that the school authorities may feel quite assured that their possession of the new building would be continued so long as it was used for the education of the Indians. If your Lordship is now inclined to take the same view as the Department we would consider the possibility of proceeding with the new building on the new site during the coming summer. In this event I should be glad to hear from you at an early date.
