Dear Mr. Abraham -

We have a communication from Mr. Agent Picotte, regarding the portable saw-mill. He states that he was expecting a visit from you and delayed setting up the mill. He says that he considers it too late now but that it might be set up early in the spring in ample time to cut whatever logs might be brought in during the season. He also states that he will require the services of one man who understands the machinery and that the Indians will provide the rest of the help.

Do you consider that anything might be done immediately, or do you agree with the agent that the work had better be postponed until the spring?
