Dear Miss:-

I have your letter of the 15th instant relative to the Afgans needed at the Ford Hotel and also to other matters pertaining to the weaving Studio.

Relative to the Afgans I may say that these will be delivered today or tomorrow morning. The Afgans in stock are all of 2½ yards long are will be marked at \$10.00. They will be marked without the knowledge of the girls. *known*

I have paid a visit to the Studio and told the girls that their efforts will soon be rewarded if, of course, they do co-operate fully with us. They seemed to be pleased and I believe every thing will go along satisfactorily.

Eunice has not yet been told that she is not required any longer as she is not through with the carpet. However she has not made too much trouble at the Studio lately. Her nights out are about the only thing Miss Foisie has to complain about for the past week.

Mr. Thibeault came last week and together we visited the Bush School and the teacher's residence. It seemed that Mr. Thibeault will recommend the demolition of these two buildings and that mostly all the lumber salvaged could be utilized for the building of a Studio which would be built at a reasonable cost.

I interviewed Jos. Curotte re; Toronto. Jos., claims to be earning \$3.50 per day here as a carpenter and to be sure of having work till the cold weather sets in. He would go to Toronto for the same pay but not less. Kindly let me know if this is acceptable.
