Eunice has not yet been told that she is not required any longer as she is not through with the carpet. However she has not made too much trouble at the Studio lately. Her nights out are about the only thing Miss Foisie has to complaint about for the past week.

Mr.Thibeault came last week and together we visited the Bush School and the teacher's residence. It seemed that Mr.Thibeaut will recommend the demolition of these two buildings and that mostly all the lumber salwaged could be utilized for the building of a Studio which would be built at a reasonable cost.

I interviewed Jos.Curotte re; Toronto. Jos., claims to be earning \$3.50 per day here as a carpenter and to be sure of having work till the cold weather sets in. He would go to Toronto for the same pay but not less. Kindly let me know if this is acceptable.
