

- A.109 From 1940 to 1945, the only RQMS they had.
- Q.110 Was your work satisfactory?
- A.110 Yes, Sir.
- Q.111 How can you prove that fact?
- A.111 By a letter they gave to me from the OC Lt-Col Merner. He gave me the letter.
- Q.112 Do you recognize this as a certified true copy of that letter?
- A.112 Yes, that is right, Sir.
- Q.113 Will you present it to the Court, please?
- A.113 Yes, Sir.
- Certified true copy of a letter dated 30 May 1945 and signed by Lt-Col Merner is read, signed by the Lt-Col Merner, is read, signed by the President and attached to the proceedings - see document "I".
- Q.114 When did you rejoin the military forces?
- A.114 I rejoined in December 1945 in St. Jerome.
- Q.115 And where were you posted?
- A.115 After that I was posted to FMR in Montreal as RQMS A & T Staff and following that I was with 16 Recce Regt in Bury.
- Q.116 The 16th Recce Regt is where?
- A.116 Bury, P.Q. 25 miles this side of Sherbrooke.
- Q.117 Where had your home been established?
- A.117 In Montreal.
- Q.118 Did you move your wife to Bury?
- A.118 Yes, I did.
- Q.119 Was the move successful? Was your wife happy?
- A.119 No, Sir.
- Q.120 What action did you take?
- A.120 Well, after the report I had from the doctor, after my wife was pregnant 3 times, I could not find any accommodation, I moved my wife at my expense back to Montreal.
- Q.121 Before you moved your wife did you make any requests through official channels?
- A.121 Yes, Sir. I asked for transfer through Major Leduc in Quebec to go back to Montreal.
- Q.122 To whom did you make this request?
- A.122 Major Leduc in Quebec.
