Dear Sir:

Regarding the area in the south-east corner of Indian Reserve 13 where we estimate possibly a million feet of mostly cedar, we still feel that this area should be logged even though the band on the south-end of the Reserve have objected to releasing this portion.

The preservation for the Indians of this portion for fuel is of no concern as cedar is of no value for fuel.

The Band located on the North portion of I.R. 13 are very much in favour of this area being logged and we feel that your Department is favourable. The North Band feel that this area should be logged as they have released their entire area to us.

We have discussed this matter for considerable time with yourself and your Vancouver office and would suggest the question of logging the above timber be re-opened.
