

KILBRIDE.

A post village in the township of Nelson, situated on the stage road leading from Hamilton to Milton, and distant from Hamilton sixteen miles, from Milton seven miles, and twenty-three from Guelph. It contains two churches, the Canada Presbyterian church a good frame style gothic, 36 by 50 feet, built in 1854 at a cost of about \$1,600; seated for three hundred persons, there is an old church and cemetery in connection with it, Rev. W. H. Simpson minister. The New Connexion Methodist church a handsome frame building of about similar size, Rev. F. Haynes minister. A good school house, a good general store where Messrs. White & Co., carry on a large and extensive trade, a tavern, woollen mills, a saw mill, three blacksmith shops, one wagon shop, two shoemakers and one tailor shop.

There is an Orange Hall where L.O.L. No. 440 holds its regular meetings.
