

His Excellency in ouncil on the recommenda-tion of the Hon, the Minister of Finance, and under the authority aforesaid, has been pleased to order, and it is he eby ordered, that a duty of ten per cent be imposed, "from and after the first day of January next," and the same is hereby authorised to be levied and collected on Ten and Coffee imported into Canada from the United States of America.
