"THE LIVING CHURCH" COMES TO MILWAUKEE. "THE CHURCH ECLECTIC" GOES TO NEW YORK.

will be under the same editorial management which has so successfully conducted **The Young Churchman** for thirty years past, bringing it to very much the largest circulation of any American Church Periodical; and which has for the past five years conducted **The Church Eclectic**, and for fifteen years **The Living Church Quarterly**. It thus falls into experienced hands, and will issue from the largest Church publishing house in America.

Many improvements are under contemplation. There will be many illustrations, representing more particularly the events of current interest in the Church. The more important Church news will be fuller, and promptly published; the less important, more condensed. There will be special papers on important topics, by the best writers. The world—its literature, progress, politics, art—will be viewed from the standpoint of the Church, and the Church from the standpoint of Catholic thought. The editorial policy will always be frank and outspoken; but controversy will not be its main desire. 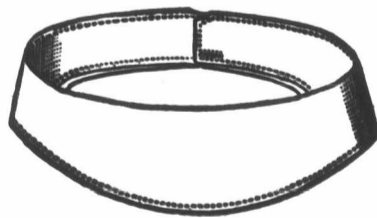
