The Council have not agreed to a Bill, entitled, An Act in addition to and amendment of, an Act, passed in the sisty-ninth year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for incorporating certain Persons, therein mentioned, for Insuring Houses, Buildings, Goods, Wares and Merchandises, from loss and damage by sire. And also,

A Bill, entitled, An Act to encourage the raising of Bread Corn.

The Council request a Conference by Committee, on the subject of the Treasury Note Bill.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Resolved, That this House do agree to the Conference, as desired by the Council, and that the Clerk do acquaint the Council therewith.

Ordered, That Mr. Ritchie, Mr. Lawson, and Mr. Ruggles, do manage the said conference.

And they went to the conference.

And being returned,

Mr. Ritchie reported that the Managers had been at the conference, and stated the substance of the conference to the House: and thereupon,

On motion, resolved, That a further Conference be defired with the Council, on the subject of the last conference, and that the Clerk do request the same.

The Clerk reported, that the Council had agreed to a further conference, as defired by

Ordered, That the Managers who managed the last conference, do manage this conference.

And they went to the conference.

And being returned,

Mr. Ritchie reported that the Managers had been at the Conference, and stated the substance of the conference to the House.

On motion of Mr. Roach, resolved, That the Resolution of this House, passed on the sourteenth day of April, 1819, respecting the several Townships and Settlements entitled to a Provincial Allowance for Schools, shall not be continued in sorce after the sirst day of May next.

A Message from the Council by Mr. George,

Mr. Speaker,

The Council have not agreed to a Bill, entitled. An Act to empower the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to Issue Treasury Notes.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Mr. Archibald reported from the Committee appointed to prepare an Address, to His Excellency the Kight Honorable the Governor in Chief, on the subject of the Resolution passed on the 28th ultimo; that the Committee had drawn up an Address accordingly; and he read the Address in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's Table, where it was read, and is as follows:
