REVERSED AND JUMPED.

Engineer's Action Causes Peculiar Wreck at Brantford.

Brantford, Aug. 20.—A peculiar accident occurred on the Tillsonburg division of the Grand Trunk yesterday. At Mount Pleasant an engine and freight collided in a head-on crash about 8 o'clock. The engineer on the west-bound, in order to avert disaster, if possible, reversed the engine, but neglected to shut off the throttle. The crew then jumped and escaped injury.

The engine crashed into the freight and following the impact of the shock began to back up with increasing speed, until, when it reached Brantford, a distance of five miles, it was tearing along the track at the rate of 60 miles an hour.

In West Brantford the engine became unmanned, jumped the tracks, ripping up the ties for some distance in attempting to round the curve.

LEADING DOUBLE LIVES.

Sensational Charges Made by a Presbyterian Pastor.

Peterboro, Aug. 20.—At the evening service of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church here, on Sunday, the pastor, Rev. J. G. Potter, created a sensation.

He made a strong denunciation of the inconsistencies of church members, and charged a minister of another Presbyterian church in the city with having been seen drinking at the bar of a summer resort hotel at Burleigh Falls, Stony Lake. He declared that this conduct of affairs was intolerable, and further denounced church members for giving Sunday excursions and acting thereon in an unbecoming manner, which they would not do at home. His charge made from the pulpit, that church members were leading double lives, has aroused much feeling among the congregations dealt with.
