The latter keenly feels her misfortune, but appreciates the fact that her position might be much worse, but in her heart she feels that the little girl will bring her father to her.

## Turkey Faces a Revolution; Peace or War is the Issue

Cabinet Majority at Stormy Meeting Decided on Entering Into Negotiations with the Allies, but Germans Halted Action—Bludgeoned Peace Advocates Into Submission.

Constantza, Roumania, March 27.—News from a reliable source in Constantinople, reaching here today tells of a bitter struggle raging between the peace party and the war party, in the Turkish capital. The former is composed of Germanophile officers of the army and navy and those Turkish statesmen who, since the beginning of the conflict, have never ceased to deplore what they regard as the political crime that permitted Turkey to be used as a cat's paw of Germany.

The war party consists of the militant young Turks, headed by Enver Pasha, and their German military advisers. Enver, obedient to the behests of the Kaiser, is favorable to the continuance of the war against the Allies.

The peace party demand immediate capitulation, realizing how hopeless is the struggle. So far as Turkey is concerned, they argue that if Turkey stands now, the enemy and especially England, may be merciful and that some of the dwindling Turkish Empire may yet be saved from the melting pot.

So, while the Allied fleet is pounding the forts of the Dardanelles, the rival political factions in the capital are waging a sharp struggle for the mastery. The feud may culminate in revolution and bloodshed.

The military league, which gathered under the banner of the foe of Enver and his committee of Union and Progress, has been reconstituted and its secret propaganda, which aims at freeing Turkey at once from the German and Young Turk incubus, has gained many adherents and has split the army in twain.

Government Feared Coup d'Etat.  
Fear of a coup d'etat led the Government four days ago to abandon its bellicose attitude and contemplate arranging of a separate peace. There was a stormy sitting of the cabinet. The council had decided by a majority to enter into negotiations with the Allies and to proceed to the Dardanelles, accompanied by two Turkish delegates with plenary powers. The ambassador was to be asked to sound the Allies and ascertain what conditions they were prepared to offer for the surrender of the Dardanelles and Constantinople. At the last moment, General Liman von Sanders, the German commander, got wind of the Turkish intention and broke into the cabinet-meeting. He first expostulated and finally menaced the peace majority with instant arrest and the penalties of martial law, vowing that he would shoot anyone, whether members of the government or not, who attempted to communicate with the Allies to submit proposals for capitulation.

The general bludgeoned the Government into submission to his will, insisting on resistance so long as the Dardanelles were not forced. He turned a deaf ear to the pleading of the peace advocates that Turkey had already made an honorable defence and that it was useless to prolong a struggle which had already cost so many Turkish lives, and that the fall of the Dardanelles was simply a question of time, whether it takes place tomorrow or two weeks hence.

## TO SELL FISH TO NEWFOUNDLAND

Novel Experiment to Be Tried This Year by Fishermen of Iceland.

St. John's, Nfld., March 27.—Although bringing fish to Newfoundland would seem like carrying coals to Newcastle, there is a prospect that it will be attempted on a considerable scale this year. The proposition comes from Iceland. Because of the war, the markets of northern Europe are closed to the fishermen of that island, and they are forced to seek a new outlet. Since the fishing operations of the Newfoundland coast will be largely curtailed this season as a result of the large number of Newfoundlanders who have joined the British Army and Navy, the Icelanders think they will be able to dispose of a large part of their product here. As it is proposed to purchase here foodstuffs and other goods for return cargoes to Iceland, the idea is looked upon with favor in this colony.
