CHEAP FARES ABOLISHED. No More Low Passenger Rates to Pacific Coast Points. Montreal, Oct. 15.—Mr. Robert Kerr, passenger traffic manager of the C. P. R., has just returned from Chicago, where he was present at the meeting of the Transcontinental Lines Association last week. He says that it was decided to stop issuing collector rates to California and other points on the Pacific coast. This puts an end to the thirty-three-dollar one-way rate to such places as Los Angeles, which many people have taken advantage of in the past during the autumn months in order to pass the winter in a mild climate. The abolition of these cheap rates is in retaliation for the public's demand for a two-cent rate.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. ANY one numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, containing 35, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of the family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less. Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-agent. Entry by proxy may, however, be made on certain conditions by the applicant's mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be subject to appeal to the Department, subject to the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land may be sold until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by the Department. In case of "persuasion" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all rights in the land. An application for inspection must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible under the regulations, and only due application for inspection will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of. A homesteader whose entry is in good standing and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to the Department, relinquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but no one else on filing declaration of abandonment. Where an entry is summarily cancelled, the applicant may, at his option, be entitled to a refund of the fee paid, if the cancellation is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry, should the statement in question have been granted it may be summarily cancelled. DUTIES.—A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (2) If the settler is a homesteader, or if the father is deceased, of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for such homestead, and the requirements to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of the homestead, the requirements may be satisfied by residence upon such land. Before making application for patent the settler must file a statement in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so. MINING REGULATIONS. COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for a period of 21 years, or for an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2500 acres shall be leased to one individual, and the royalty at the rate of five or ten cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable coal. QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age, or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1500 x 1200 feet. The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year to be renewed, or recorded in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre. The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2 1/2 per cent. on the sales. Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square, and may be renewed by recording in lieu thereof. An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold, of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one month from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent. collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000. Deputy of the Minister of the Interior.
