London, Oct. 25.—Postmaster General Sydney Buxton replying to a member stated that he was glad to say he had come to an arrangement with Newfoundland in reference to extending the advantages of the Canadian magazine post to that colony similar to that made with the Dominion government, namely that in view of particular local circumstances, the postage of magazines, newspapers, trade journals, from Great Britain to Newfoundland would be reduced from 4d. to 1d. per pound.
