FARMINGTON, New Mexico, November 28.

An Indian runner has arrived here with the first news of the movement of the 12th Cavalry, acting as escort to General Scott, and ordered to the Navajo Indians' reservation to aid due the incipient uprising. General Scott, accompanied only by an Indian interpreter, left the Noel trading post at the foot of Beautiful Mountain, an Indian stronghold, for a pow-wow with the Navajo chiefs. Scott left his cavalry escort fifteen miles away, proceeding on horseback to the top of the mountain. The outcome of his conference will decide whether the Indians will surrender without fighting. Should Chief Beshoshe, with whom Scott is conferring, spurn his overtures of peace, the Indians will move against the Indians immediately. Many Indians are reported to have recently joined the band of recalcitrants on Beautiful Mountain.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 28.

Some 1,500 unemployed men gathered in Market Square to-night to attend a meeting called by Labor men. Addresses were made and a resolution passed asking the Mayor, Aldermen and Controllers to use their influence to relieve the serious situation which confronts the city, by the opening of relief works, or in any other way they may consider fit. We don't ask for charity, we want work.

JARROW, Eng., Nov. 28.

The largest oil-carrying vessel in the world, having a capacity of 15,000 tons of oil, was launched today and christened San Hilario by Mrs. Carr, of New York City. The new ship is one of ten tank-steamers of the same size, now being constructed for the Eagle Oil Transport Co.

TOKIO, Nov. 28.

Confirmation has been received of a conspiracy in the island of Formosa to overthrow Japanese rule there. The plot is widespread. The instigators planned to organize an army of 100,000 to massacre the Japanese, and restore Formosa to China.

ALPENA, Mich., Nov. 28.

The heavy seas and high winds which prevailed yesterday, made it impossible for tugs to release the steamer Nicholas which is on the rocks at North Point in Thunder Bay. She has a cargo of flax, valued at \$353,000.

NEWCASTLE, Nov. 28.

The Chilean battleship Almirante Latorre was launched at Elswick shipyards today. She has a displacement of 28,000 tons and her engines are expected to develop over 37,000 indicated horse power. The contract calls for a speed of 23 knots.

Wreckage Picked Up.

Deputy Minister of Customs LeMessurier received the following message last evening from the Sub-Collector at Port au Port:—

"Twelve barrels of flour, a small dory or river-boat, and a companion ladder were picked up in this bay yesterday. The letters K and the word Gaspe, on the barrels, are the only marks on the wreckage."

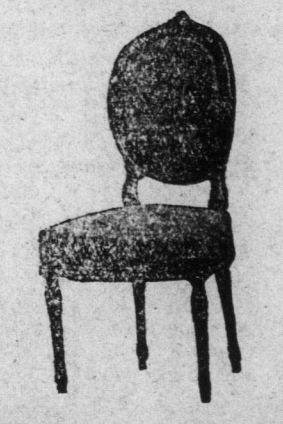
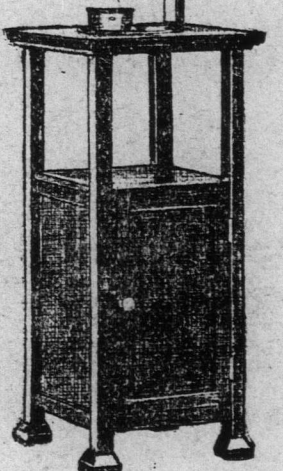
