## The Wizard of the North

Walter Scott was born in Edinburgh on August 18, 1771. His father was a lawyer, the first of the Scott line to leave the open country for the town. For a man who wrote such a prodigious number of works Scott was surprisingly late in getting started, being 34 years old when his first original work appeared, entitled "The Lay of the Last Minstrel." From that moment until his death on September 21, 1832, he was, with the possible exception of Byron, the most popular writer in English. When the public seemed to be tiring of his long romances in verse, he turned to novel writing, and in 1814, when he was 43, he came into his career of greatness with "Waverley." For 18 years, novel after novel followed in rapid succession, stirring romances of history or colorful tales of Scottish life. They were all published anonymously until the financial disaster of 1825 made it wise to reveal the author's name. Fully a dozen of the Waverley Novels, if not more, might be included in any list of 100 best novels, and many lovers of Scott would even then think that one or two might be added. He was, as Stevenson remarked, "the king of the romances." "Waverley," "Ivanhoe," "The Heart of Midlothian," and "Kenilworth" are representative of Scott at his best. But "Old Mortality," "Quentin Durward," "The Talisman," "Guy Riquart," "The Fortunes of Nigel," "The Antiquary," "St. Rollox," "Rob Roy," and others have all been ranked as favorites among the innumerable admirers of the romances written by "The Wizard of the North."

## Work For The Winter.

NEW PLANS TO RELIEVE UNEMPLOYMENT.

The Government has decided to set up a special Committee to consider afresh the problem of the present unemployment in the country, with a view to further remedial measures. Mr. Lloyd George, in the House of Commons, informed Captain Wedgwood Benn that a Cabinet Committee

had already had the whole question of unemployment during the coming winter under consideration, and that it was expected to report at an early date. The new Cabinet Committee that had been appointed would also review the whole position of trade and unemployment.

Meanwhile steps were being taken to circulate local authorities with a view to the submitting of schemes of public work which might be undertaken during the autumn and winter with Government assistance, should circumstances appear to justify such schemes being put into operation. Lloyd's Weekly.
