## Ben Langford Fought Johnson.

THE NEGRO FLOORED 200 lb. JOHNSON IN THE FOUR-TEENTH ROUND OF BOIT.

NEW YORK. The arrival of Jack Johnson in this city and his evident

intention of remaining here in an effort to re-enter the ring, has resulted in much discussion as to his past pugilistic status. Johnson began to climb the Queensbury ladder in 1902 and he reached the top rung in 1910, when he defeated the then passe Jeffries.

It was in 1901 and 1904 that John-

son did his best work in the ring. He defeated in those years negro boxers of ability, such as Joe Jeannette, Sam McVey, Frank Childs, Black Bill and Ed Martin. He also defeated Sandy Ferguson and Jim Jeffords, and failed to stop Joe Grim in 6 rounds.

While Johnson's record is by no

means impressive, he has to his credit one victory which on its face seems to stamp him as a great fighter. He is credited with defeating Sam Langford on points in a 15 round bout at Chelsea, Mass., April 26, 1906.

Although Langford at that time weighed but 147 pounds to 200 by Johnson and was very much smaller in all physical measurements, the Tar Baby was justly regarded as the most formidable fighter in three classes--middle, light heavy and heavyweight. Therefore when it was announced that Johnson had received the decision of the referee at the end of 15 rounds the big black was acclaimed a future champion.

Trustworthy statements by eyewitnesses of the contest make it appear that Johnson's victory over Langford was by no means so decisive as the former would like to have the public believe. The best thing Johnson did during the encounter was to floor Langford in the second round, but the latter was on his feet at the ten count. Langford landed with crashing effect in the third and fourth rounds and thereafter Johnson adopted defensive tactics and could not be induced to exchange thumps with his stumpy and combative opponent.

By using his feet and covering, Johnson kept out of danger until the fourteenth round, when Langford hooked the big fellow on the chin and sent him to the floor for a count of seven seconds.

When Johnson finally got on his feet he clinched till the bell sent him to his corner. He ran away and hugged alternately during the fifteenth round, and when he got the decision of the referee he was quite as much astonished as was Langford.

Quite naturally the result of their bout called for a return match, but while Langford made desperate efforts to again get Johnson into the ring he failed. He did succeed in getting another match, the fighters agreeing to meet in the National Sporting Club, London, in 1908. Johnson was in London at the time, and Langford, on being informed that Johnson had consented to fight made all preparations to sail.

In the meantime Johnson received an offer to go to Australia and box Tommy Burns, then the champion. Before sailing for Sydney, Johnson, signed an agreement with the National Sporting Club by the terms of which he bound himself to return to England immediately after his bout with Burns and fulfill his match with Langford. Johnson violated the agreement and did not go to England, but returned to America by way of San Francisco. The National Sporting Club sent a photograph of the John-

son-agreement to this city as proof of the fighter's broken faith.

Johnson returned to America in the early part of 1909 and began an exhibition tour. He was filling an engagement at the Star Theatre, Brooklyn, when one night Langford jumped on the stage and demanded a title match. Langford told Johnson he would show him who was champion. Johnson called on the theatre special officers to eject Langford, and Langford scored another and final failure in his attempts to get a match with Johnson.
