Would the appeal be so strong that, did he need the advertised thing, he would hasten to in-

As a result of his "dog" test, sometimes he struck out words, put in others. Perhaps he lengthened the message. Perhaps he put a headline on it.

This advertiser knows how beneficial is "trying Want Ads on the dog." Since he adopted the practice, he has averaged much better advertising returns.

Besides using this hint, another excellent idea is to invoke the aid of several friendly critics. The Want Ad originating within the home usually gains strength if the writer of it, having first tried it on himself, submite it to other members of the family. How does it sound to different ones? Is there anything lacking? How would they make it stronger?

Finally, if you have any doubt about your written Want Ad, try it on the folks at the Want Ad counter. If they see opportunities for improvement, they will be glad to help you. (All Rights Reserved.)




