OPENING DAY AT KENILWORTH.

Large Crowd Sees a Good Card of
Races—General News of the
Turf.

AT SHEEPSHEAD BAY.
New York, Aug. 29.—Hamburg Belle, worthy daughter of the famous Hamburg, is queen of the turf. She won the Futurity to-day in footling not to her liking, but with an ease marred only by her swerve near the finish. For this the splendid filly made ample amends by the tremendous burst of speed she showed when straightened out again, carrying her to the wire in front. Her performance, the full six furlongs in 1:11, is the record for the race at this distance. From 1892 to 1901, inclusive, the Futurity course was 170 feet short of six furlongs. Savable made the record of 1:11 last year.

Throughout, she was the speediest and at the end, the gamest, coming on in the heaviest part of the track near the rail with the courage of an Amazon and the swiftness of the wind. Fuller rode with perfect judgment. When Leonidas challenged, a sixteenth from the finish, he stuck Hamburg Belle with his whip and spirit rebelled and she leaped aside six feet, reducing her length's lead to nothing. With lightning intuition the boy dropped his whip and sitting down to ride, called on the beautiful filly to do her best. Nobly she responded and, spurring away, showed off her hardy half-brother, winning the greatest 2-year-old prize of the world by a head.

No shame rests on little Leonidas for his defeat. Giving his sister six pounds more than he had, he was haced from post to finish like the splendid thoroughbred he is. The Minute Man, of John E. Madden's entry, was third, four lengths behind Leonidas. His placing among the first three was lucky.

The big field got away in excellent alignment. Delhi seemed quickest, with Hamburg Belle, Leonidas, and the Minute Man ranged alongside and all in the centre of the track. These, except Delhi, soon were clear, and Fuller was on even terms with the foremost. He had Hamburg Belle in restraint through the dip, where the going is softer, but when he reached the hard ground just before the elbow he let her down a bit and her head showed in front as the leaders wheeled into the stretch. Delhi went back quickly, but the despised Lady Amelia had joined the front rank. Hamburg Belle and Leonidas alone were prominent when the stretch was reached. Little Em had hung on well, but Bromsick was far out of it. His stable mate, Audley, running far better. Passing the last eighth pole, it was Hamburg Belle by a length, Leonidas a half length, Little Em a head and the Minute Man. But Hamburg Belle was tripping along easily, and as Leonidas was coming fast, Fuller drew his whip, and the filly sprang away from the blow, evidently disconcerted, but not in cowardice. Her spring sideways carried her into the deep mud near the rail, and when Fuller saw this he set her down in a flash with hands and heels to mend it. The response was magnificent. Hamburg Belle straightened out like a greyhound and, with a single bound toward the near goal. In a second she was going faster than Leonidas and in a moment more was home first winner and greatest turf heroine of 1903.

The Fall handicap, also one of the features of the day, was won in a gallop by the favorite, Shot Gun, who revealed in the slop, and then, when he came up a gap of four lengths in the first quarter and won easily by three lengths.
