The sergeant manifested great composure and tied the handkerchief about his eyes, but the corporal showed signs of weakness. Twenty-two soldiers fired at them, and they fell at the first shot, but each was shot through the head afterward. The garrison, after the execution, was marched past the bodies, and when opposite them were commanded to look at them. The crime which the men expiated was the murder of Lieutenant Calapiz Santiago of the custom house here, about a month ago.
