MANY VISITORS AT WOODBINE

OWNERS FROM ACROSS THE LINE SEE THEIR HORSES AT WORK.

Well Known Candidates Make Their Appearance at the Park to-day.

Graveston Result and Entries.

That the coming meeting of the Ontario Jockey Club will surpass all previous years as to the class of sport is certain, judging from the numbers of good horses now quartered at Woodbine Park. Never in the history of the Canadian turf have the prospects for a successful gathering been so flourishing, and all that is required to complete the success is fine weather next week. The green verdure of the infield and lawns presents an attractive appearance, while the bustle about the stands reminds one that race-day is close at hand. A visitor to the course yesterday morning was struck by the appearance of many new horses on the track, the Americans making their debut and adding greatly to the scene. Among those somewhat familiar to the Toronto race-goer was that good horse Copyright, while Little Logan was also recognized by many as was the old jumper, Pat Oakley. All the horses that arrived on Thursday from across the line were out for an airing and given work. Among the American horsemen present to watch the work of their horses was Mr. Alex Shields, who, though once a resident of Toronto, now lives in Uncle Sam's domain, at Round Brook, N.J. Mr. Shields brought no less than ten horses with him, and his many friends here hoped to see his colors many times in front next week. Mr. M. J. Daly, who is now a well-known figure at the O.J.C. meetings, was present watching the work of J. G. Carr's horses, in whose charge they are, while Mr. Tom Welch, whose first visit it is to Canada, was superintending the preparation of his two good selling fillies, Wheeler and Kilkenny.

The morning was delightful, and the crowd of racing enthusiasts was large in consequence, there being thousands seeking tips and bets from the trainers. The work of the horses, as a rule, was of the moderate order, there being little fast work done. The horses, however, showed to better advantage in the races.

St. Albans in Parker's string, breeched a mile in 1:55.

All Blue covered the same distance in 1:57.

The Lepanto gelding negotiated a mile and a quarter in 2:23. This comprised nearly all the stray work, the other horses being given slow gallops.

The old jumper, Lexington, after unseating two jockeys yesterday afternoon, to the delight of the crowd, galloped away with the third and broke down in the stretch.

The stable of William Hendrie, C. Boyle and J. Dymont will arrive from Hamilton to-day.

Queen's Plate.

As to the probable result of the Queen's Plate, the present indications are still that Her Majesty's prize will again go to Waterloo. Northrup, however, is a fast trier made by Lechman, it is doubtful if he will be able to hold his own against the Seagraves contingent, and as for Thorndike he has proved a decided disappointment, while Chickie may end the distance a trifle farther than he was expected to go.

Though, no doubt, Mr. Duggan's representative will in time prove a very clever filly, and there are many who wish the master of Newmarket success next Tuesday. Suequahanna, who will carry John Dymont's colors, has showed up well in her work at Hamilton, but as the track is very fast her performance in private, like that of Lechman, are not to be relied on as comparing with the work of the public.
