

THE PACIFIC CABLE.

The Project Taking Definite Shape-Mr. Chamberlain Agrees to a Commission.

London, Nov. 19.—All of the colonial agents in London except the representatives of West and South Australia had a conferrence with Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, Secretary of State for the Colonies, at the Colonial Office today, with the result that Mr. Chamberlain agreed to appoint a commission to arrange the details of the construction of the proposed Pacific cable. The Imperial Government, Australia and Canada will each appoint two delegates upon the commission, which will proceed with its work as soon as possible.

The representatives of the Cape colony, Natal, were also present at the meeting, and Mr. Chamberlain remarked that the presence of representatives of colonies having no concern in the project in its present form was an evidence of solidarity and sympathy. He expressed the opinion that the project showed a fair prospect of remunerative return upon the capital required.

It was arranged that the Colonial

required.

It was arranged that the Colonial governments should nominate delegates to the commission, whom the Imperial Government will confirm, as the commission will consider and report upon the whole subject in all its aspects.

The conference endorsed the resolutions adopted by the Intercolonial conference held at Ottawa in 1894 in favor of commercial reciprocity between the United Kigdom and its colonies.
