Distribution of Seed Grain and Potatoes

From The Dominion Experimental Farms. 1913-1914.

By instructions of the Hon. Minister of Agriculture a distribution of superior sorts of grain and potatoes will be made sorts of grain and potatoes will be made during the coming vinter and spring to Canadian farmers. The samples for general distribution will consist of spring wheat (5 lbs.), white oats (4 lbs.), barley (5 lbs.), and field neas (5 lbs.). These will be sent out from Ottawa. A distribution of potatoes (in 3 lb. samples) will be carried on from several of the experimental farms, the Central Farm at Ottawa supplying only the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. All samples will be sent free, by mail.

Applicants must give particulars in regard to the soil on their farms, and some account of their experience with such kinds of grain (or potatoes) as they have grown, so that a promising sort for their conditions may be selected.

Each application must be separate and

must be signed by the applicant. Only one sample of grain ard one of potatoes can be sent to each farm. Applications on any kind of printed form cannot be accepted. If two or more samples are asked cepted. If two or more samples are asked for in the same letter only one will be

As the supply of seed is limited, farm-As the supply of seed is limited, farmers are advised to apply early; but the applications will not necessarily be filled in the exact order in which they are received. Preference will always be given to the most thoughtful and explicit requests. Applications received after the end of January will probably be too late. All applications for grain (and applications from the provinces of Ontario and Quebec for potatoes) should be addressed to the Dominion Cerealist, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa. Such applications require no postage. If otherwise addressed delay and disappointment may occur.

APPLE TREE CANKER.

Recommendations For Preventing and Curing Serious Orchard Evil. Of all bark diseases of fruit trees none is worse than apple blister can-

Experiments conducted in orchards for the purpose of discovering means of treating the disease led to the conclusion that where wounds are made on apple trees accidentally or by the removal of branches or limbs some form of covering should be applied as soon after as possible to prevent the entrance of the fungus spores.

Tests were made in covering tree wounds with white lead paint, asphaltum and paraffin. Treatment attempt

ed after the sap had begun to flow was attended with difficulty. Where the cankered limb was cut off or the diseased bark was removed and the wound treated some of the wounds showed that the fungus continued to grow in spite of the covering.

Recommendations for prevention are that when a branch or limb is severed the cut should be as smooth and as close as possible, that as far as possible tree trimming should be done when the sap is not flowing and that all wounds should be covered with some kind of dressing. Of the tree covering materials mentioned it was impossible to determine which was the

Other protective measures consist in spraying of branches, limbs and trunks of apple trees and removal and destruction by fire of all brush. All dead trees should be grubbed out by the roots and burned .- Country Gentleman.

Value of the Wheel Hoe. The wheel hoe, a light cultivator to be operated by man power, is regarded with amusement by many who raise acreage crops. They consider it a nice little plaything for the suburban resident and the boy with a garden. The wheel hoe has, however, undeveloped possibilities as a real farm tool. For instance, if one is kept near the kitch en garden somebody is likely to pick it up almost any night after supper

A New Veil.

It is accordion plaited, and has a number of practical points. It is easy of adjustment, as it clings to the edge of the hat, and it can be conveniently rolled up and carried about in a handbag without becoming mussed. The material may be either net or chiffon, but soft chiffon is the most satisfactory. You may have the plaits run any direction that you choose. The sel-vage forms the top and bottom finish, and hems are necessary only in the back. A plait three-eights of an inch deep is a good size. Consult a plaiter as to the amount of material required for a certain shape and size. finishing of the edges must be done before the plaiting is put in.

Caste and Diet In India. The private secretary f the maharajah of Jhalawar gave a lecture on food in London, in the course of which he stated that the eating of onions is con ducive to "darkness of spirit." He also averred that the caste system in India is largely regulated by diet. Thus, those of the highest caste only eat vegetarian meals in order to keep their souls pure.
