ADVANCE IN PULP WOOD.

(Herald.)

Within a week the price of wood pulp has advanced from eighteen dollars to twenty-three dollars in the Halifax market. This seems to be a permanent advance as contracts are offered at this price. It is predicted by paper makers that news will advance ten dollars per ton before the new year. This advance has been anticipated because a great deal of activity exists amongst the pulp makers in New England in securing wood. Within a few weeks no less than four hundred thousand dollars worth of pulp wood lands has been purchased by the agents of New England mills from land owners along the south shore. The cost of transportation makes the cost of wood at the mills about eight dollars more than it costs at any of the local mills in Nova Scotia.

It would be good advice to give to owners of forest areas to hold them and keep the trees out. They will not depreciate in value.

It looks as though, in consequence of these advances in pulp, the price of newspapers would have to be doubled or their size be cut in halves.

THREE DAY MAIL SERVICE.

Lord Strathcona emphasizes the enormous advantage to Canada, when a steamer leaving a British port every Saturday reaches Canada the following Wednesday. Three twenty-five knot boats would thus suffice for the service, and London would be brought within eight days of the Pacific, and with the desired twenty-knot boats on the Pacific the journey from London to Australia would be lessened by eight days.

It is believed the part Canada is destined to play in the history of the world would surpass all expectations. The fast service would greatly assist this expansion and the sun-dried fruit from the British and Canadian exchange was not too great, seeing the vast benefits accruing to both.

An influential committee, including eight Peers, two Irish Roman Catholic Bishops, and forty members of Parliament, including Messrs. Wyndham and Long, two ex-Irish Secretaries, has been formed to support the Blacksea Bay route in connection with the proposed fast mail service. Both the British and Canadian Ministers are, however, dealing with the project on the subsidiary basis alone, leaving the contractors, whoever they may be, to settle ports and routes, subject, of course, to rigorous conditions as to time and equal facilities to all Canadian railways.

The engineer leaped from the cab and found Mr. Atkins in a semi-conscious condition. Blood was streaming from cuts on his face. He had been down the track for a walk, and it is thought while on his way home, was seized with a sick turn and fell on the track.

Quebec is raging a vigorous fight against tuberculosis. In March last a by-law was passed providing that all milk cows coming into the city be tested before being sold, and in April another providing for the testing of all cows within the city every six months, the city paying two-thirds of the cost. Since then one hundred and sixty-three tubercular cows that have been sent out of Quebec have been sent to Montreal, and are now in use there.
